WHERE ARE WE SAILING? Most of the cruising activity takes place in an area about 15-20 miles long and just half that in width, extending from Jost Van Dyke to Virgin Gorda. The prevailing winds are steady from an easterly or northeasterly direction. The water is warm, clean and clear with the bottom visible to as much as 40 feet below. Beautiful fish and coral can be seen anywhere while snorkelling.

WHAT ELSE CAN WE DO? Among the most popular stops in the BVIs are the Baths at Virgin Gorda, who's boulder-formed caves shelter private swimming grottoes. The Bight and caves on Norman Island are described in Robert Louis Stevenson's "Treasure Island" - a likely setting considering the wrecks and pirates in these islands' history. Casual 'beachy' sand floor restaurants and bars are all just a quick dinghy ride



to shore. These waterfront establishments always make you feel welcome when you come ashore. The view of the sunset while anchored at Anegada, a boisterous dinner at Foxy's on Jost



Van Dyke and a visit to Leverick Bay after a sail in the Gorda Sound are all options for your fun-filled itinerary. Rest assured your BVI cruising adventures will leave you with memories to last a lifetime.

Vacation Courses - Yacht Charter Costs Explained

WHAT IS INCLUDED IN THE COST OF YOUR COURSE:

- Course instruction by a Sail Canada professionally trained and certified instructor
- Course materials
- Exams and certification fees
- Yacht charter from 1700 on the first day of your program until 0900 on the last day of your program; 7 days Saturday to Saturday
- Yacht inventory as described below
- Provisioning budget of up to \$150 USD per student (sufficient to cover 6 breakfasts, 6 lunches and 3 dinners on board). See further details below.
- Mandatory yacht charter costs listed below
- Dockage fees for the first and last night of your course

Yacht Inventory:

What is included will vary per yacht but as a guide, a charter yacht will include: dinghy, full cruising area charts and cruising guide or pilot book, navigational equipment (binoculars, hand bearing compass and course plotting equipment), initial full tank of water, fuel and cooking gas, VHF radio, autopilot, electric anchor windlass, wind instruments, furling or battened mainsail, furling genoa sail, galley equipment (cooking and eating utensils), standard safety equipment (navigational and first aid), hot water, bed linen, stereo, dodger and bimini for shade.

Most charter yachts also include GPS (plotter), cabin fans, cabin reading lights, BBQ, outboard engine, snorkelling equipment.

Provisioning Budget for On-Board Meals and Staple Supplies

Your course fee includes a provisioning allowance of up to \$150 USD per student per week. This amount should be used as a guideline when planning and ordering provisions for your 1-week course. It is sufficient to cover the cost of food (6 breakfasts, 6 lunches, 3 dinners) and drinking water. This budget is intended to cover food and water for everyone on board, including the instructor.

Advantage Boating will supply a selection of basic 'staples' on the boat, such as cleaning supplies, condiments, spices, paper towel, toilet paper, and other essentials. These items will be purchased separately and do not need to be included in your provisioning order. A complete list will be provided in advance.

We recommend appointing one student as the lead for placing the food order. Provisions can be pre-ordered up to one week before departure through RiteWay. A credit card will be required to place the order. The student who pays up front will be reimbursed by the other students using their provisioning budget. If the total cost of the provisioning exceeds the combined budget, the extra cost will be shared equally among the students. The instructor is not included in this split.

MANDATORY YACHT CHARTER COSTS INCLUDED IN YOUR COURSE:

Refundable security deposit or damage waiver:

All yachts require a security deposit (paid by Advantage Boating) and a damage waiver payment (paid by Advantage Boating) to insure your yacht while on charter. A refundable security deposit is authorized by credit card or left in cash upon arrival at the base. This amount represents the maximum deductible and any



damage to the yacht will be deducted up to the total amount authorized. A *damage waiver* is a non-refundable charge based on a daily amount. It is charged even if no damages occur to the yacht, however it offers peace of mind that even if the yacht incurs significant damage during your course, you will only incur the cost up to the maximum of the security deposit. The security deposit for your course is \$3,300 US. In the event there is a damage claim made against the boat (by the charter company), the security deposit will not be refunded to Advantage Boating, and the amount owing will be divided equally between the students onboard and made payable to Advantage Boating by e-transfer to info@advantageboating.com within 2 weeks of the completion of the course.

End cleaning, starter pack and handling fee:

These are one-time mandatory fees. The mandatory starter pack includes some basic supplies to get you started on your charter. These fees are included in your course pricing.

Fuel:

Your boat will have a full tank of fuel. Upon arrival back at the base at the end of your course the boat will need to be refilled with fuel (gas and diesel). This cost is covered in your course pricing.

Water

Water tanks on your yacht will be full upon arrival but you will have the opportunity to fill your tanks along the way should you require more. Any costs incurred during your course to refill the water tanks will be divided evenly between each student on board. You can return the yacht with empty tanks.

Cruising tax

This is a tax per person normally added in Caribbean destinations. It is normally paid upon arrival at the base or in some instances paid in advance. These fees are covered in your course pricing.

EXTRA COSTS NOT INCLUDED IN THE COST OF YOUR COURSE:

Food Provisioning, Meals Ashore & Boat Kitty

Meals ashore, alcohol and costs of provisions above the \$150 USD/person/week budget are not included.

Boat Kitty starts with each student on board contributing \$100 US dollars which covers items such as ice, garbage removal from the boat, freshwater tank refills, mooring or docking fees, taxi transfers during the week and additional groceries. If the boat kitty runs low then each student is asked to add more money. At the end of the trip any money left over in the boat kitty is divided equally among each student on board.

Mooring and anchoring fees

In the Caribbean, mooring is generally by mooring ball, anchor or at a marina facility. Mooring ball & docking fees will be divided evenly between each student on board or paid from the kitty.

Other items not included in the cost of your course:

- Provisioning costs above your split provisioning budget
- Flights and transfers
- Any land excursions, hotels, transport, car hire or taxis
- Trip cancellation and medical insurance



PRICING & INVOICING:

Our course prices are shown in US dollars. Pricing is subject to change without prior notice. A booking is not confirmed until a 50% deposit payment is received along with the filled out Advantage Boating vacation course application and Advantage Boating acknowledges and reviews your application. Payment (deposit and balance) can be made by cash (US or CAD equivalent), US or CAD bank draft, Visa (CAD equivalent) or Mastercard (CAD equivalent). At time of payment, the most current exchange rate will be used if payment is made in CAD funds or with a Credit Card

BVI COURSE BOOKING & PAYMENT TERMS:

- Booking must include this completed form along with your deposit payment.
- A deposit of 50% is due at the time of booking to secure your spot.
- All prices are in US\$ funds (unless otherwise specified) per person, per week, based on double occupancy.
- Balance payment is due Nov 1, 2025.
- Prices include yacht charter from 5:00 PM on the first day of your program until 9:00 AM on the last day of your program, yacht insurance, fuel, a budget for split provisioning on-board, course instruction by a Sail Canada professionally trained and certified instructor, course materials, and certification fees.

- Customer confirms they are a Canadian citizen travelling on a Canadian Passport valid for 6 months beyond the date of travel.
- Participants are required to adhere to all travel protocols for the Countries visited.
- Advantage Boating recommends all participants purchase travel cancellation and medical insurance to protect themselves
 from unforeseen events. It is the customer's responsibility to purchase sufficient travel cancellation insurance for their trip
 to protect them from cancellation and/or changes that result but are not limited to, flight cancellation, trip interruption, lost
 luggage, sickness, accidents, deaths, emergencies and travel advisories.
- Living standards and practices at the destination and conditions there, with respect to the provisions of utilities, services
 and accommodations, may differ from those found in Canada.
- Advantage Boating may substitute a similar yacht if unexpected circumstances arise beyond our control.
- When a Government issues a Travel Advisory, Advantage Boating will update the customer where possible. The final responsibility however lies with the Customer to be up to date with current Government Travel Advisories.
- Your course includes a budget of up to a maximum of \$150 USD per person, per week for meals on board the boat as
 described above (Provisioning Budget for On-Board Meals and Staple Supplies)
- Meals ashore, alcohol and costs of provisions above the budget are not included.
