Vacation Course Costs Explained

INCLUDED WITH YOUR COURSE:

- 8 days & 7 nights cruising and learning in the British Virgin Islands
- Course instruction by a Sail Canada professionally trained and certified instructor

- Yacht charter from 1700 on the first day of your program until 0900 on the last day of your program; 7 days Saturday to Saturday

- Provisioning budget of up to \$150 USD per student (sufficient to cover 6 breakfasts, 6 lunches and 3 dinners on board). See details below.
- Dockage fees for the first and last night of your course
- Price is per person based on shared cabin.



Yacht Inventory:

Yacht inventory included will vary per yacht but as a guide, a charter yacht will include: dinghy with outboard engine, full cruising area charts and cruising guide or pilot book, navigational equipment (binoculars, hand bearing compass and course plotting equipment), initial full tank of water, fuel and cooking gas, VHF radio, autopilot, electric anchor windlass, wind instruments, furling or battened mainsail, furling genoa sail, galley equipment (cooking and eating utensils), standard safety equipment (navigational and first aid), hot water, bed linen & towels, dodger and bimini for shade.



Most charter yachts also include GPS (plotter), cabin fans, cabin reading lights, BBQ, stereo and snorkelling equipment.

Each cabin will be set up for 2 people and include: 2 pillows, bed linens, 2 hand towels and 2 bath towels. Larger swim towels are not included.

Provisioning - Budget for On-Board Meals and Staple Supplies:

Part of your course includes learning how to provision for a week cruising onboard a sailboat. Your course fee includes a provisioning allowance of up to **\$150 USD per student per week**. Your provisioning allowance amount should be used as a guideline when planning and ordering provisions for your 1-week course. It is more than sufficient to cover the cost of food (6 breakfasts, 6 lunches, 3 dinners). This budget is intended to cover food for everyone on board, including the instructor.

Advantage Boating will also supply a selection of basic 'staples' on the boat, such as cleaning supplies, condiments, spices, paper towel, toilet paper, and other essentials. These items will be purchased separately and do not need to be included in your provisioning order. A complete list of these items will be provided in advance.

Damage Waiver and refundable Security Deposit: All charter yachts require both a *Damage Waiver* and a *Security Deposit* to provide insurance coverage during the charter. Advantage Boating pays these costs on behalf of all students, so you are not required to provide a security deposit before the course begins.

The *Damage Waiver* is a non-refundable insurance fee charged by the charter company. It reduces the amount you would be responsible for if the yacht is damaged during the charter and provides peace of mind that your financial responsibility is limited.

The *Security Deposit* is a refundable amount held by the charter company and represents the maximum deductible payable per incident if a damage claim is made. The Security Deposit for your course is USD \$3,000. In the event there is a damage claim made against the boat (by the charter company), the security deposit will not be refunded to Advantage Boating, and the amount owing will be divided equally between everyone, including the skipper, on board and made payable to Advantage Boating by e-transfer to info@advantageboating.com within two weeks of the completion of your course.



Charter company handling fees, starter pack and end of charter cleaning The charter company charges a handling fee, fees for a starter pack and for end of charter cleaning. These fees are included in your course. At the end of your course, extra food and garbage must be removed from the boat and bedding sheets, pillow cases and towels should be left in a pile in the cockpit of the boat.

Fuel Your boat will have a full tank of fuel. Upon arrival back at the base at the end of your course the boat will need to be refilled with fuel (gas and diesel). This cost is covered in the price of your course.

Water Water tanks on your yacht will be full upon arrival but you will have the opportunity to fill your tanks along the way should you require more. Any costs incurred during your course to refill the water tanks will be divided evenly between each student on board. You can return the yacht with empty tanks.

Cruising tax This is a tax per person normally added in Caribbean destinations. It is normally paid upon arrival at the base or in some instances paid in advance. This cost is covered in the price of your course.



NOT INCLUDED:

Food Provisioning above budget provided, meals ashore & boat kitty

Meals ashore, alcohol and costs of provisions above the \$150 USD/person/week budget and staple provisions are not included.

A Boat Kitty starts with each student on board contributing \$100 US dollars to cover incidental boat costs such as purchasing ice, garbage removal from the boat, freshwater tank refills if required, mooring or docking fees, onshore taxi fees during the week and additional groceries if required. If the boat kitty runs low then each student will be asked to add more money. At the end of the trip any money left over in the boat kitty will be divided equally and returned to each student on board.

Mooring and anchoring fees

In the Caribbean, mooring is generally by mooring ball, anchor or at a marina facility. Mooring ball & docking fees will be divided evenly between each student from the boat kitty.

Other items not included in the cost of your course:

- Provisioning costs above your split provisioning budget
- Flights and transfers
- Any land excursions, hotels, transport, car hire or taxis
- Trip cancellation and medical insurance
- Unblocking a blocked head onboard the charter boat - Minimum USD \$150 per blockage.



TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

PRICING & INVOICING:

Our course prices are shown in US dollars. Pricing is subject to change without prior notice but is fixed once your enrolment form is signed and your booking has been confirmed by Advantage Boating. A booking is not confirmed until a 50% deposit payment is received along with the filled out Advantage Boating vacation course application and Advantage Boating acknowledges, reviews and confirms your application. Payment (deposit and balance) can be made by cash (USD or CAD equivalent), Visa (CAD equivalent) or Mastercard (CAD equivalent). At time of payment, the most current exchange rate will be used if payment is made in CAD funds or with a Credit Card.

BVI COURSE BOOKING & PAYMENT TERMS:

- Booking must include this completed & signed form along with your deposit payment.
- A deposit of 50% is due at the time of booking to secure your spot.
- All prices are in USD funds (unless otherwise specified) per person, per week, based on double occupancy in a cabin.
- Balance payment is due October 15, 2026.
- Prices include yacht charter from 5:00 PM on the first day of your program until 9:00 AM on the last day of your program, yacht insurance, fuel, a budget for provisioning on-board, course instruction by a Sail Canada professionally trained and certified instructor, course materials, and certification fees.
- Customer confirms they understand details above: **Vacation Courses - Yacht Charter Costs Explained (Initial)**
- Customer confirms they are a Canadian citizen travelling on a Canadian Passport valid for 6 months beyond the date of travel.
- Participants are required to adhere to all travel protocols for the Countries visited.
- Advantage Boating recommends all participants purchase travel cancellation and medical insurance to protect themselves from unforeseen events. It is the customer's responsibility to purchase sufficient travel cancellation insurance for their trip to protect them from cancellation and/or changes that result but are not limited to, flight cancellation, trip interruption, lost luggage, sickness, accidents, deaths, emergencies, travel advisories and other unforeseen cancellations. .
- Living standards and practices at the destination and conditions there, with respect to the provisions of utilities, services and accommodations, may differ from those found in Canada.
- Advantage Boating may substitute a similar yacht if unexpected circumstances arise beyond our control.
- When a Government issues a Travel Advisory, Advantage Boating will update the customer where possible. The final responsibility however lies with the Customer to be up to date with current Government Travel Advisories.
- Your course includes a budget of up to a maximum of \$150 USD per person, per week for meals on board the boat as described above (Provisioning Budget for On-Board Meals and Staple Supplies)
- Meals ashore, alcohol and costs of provisions above the budget are not included.
- Dockage fees at the charter base for the first and last night of your course are included.
- Each student is expected to contribute \$100 USD to a 'Boat Kitty' which covers items such as ice, fresh water tank refills, mooring or docking fees, taxi transfers, and additional groceries. If the boat kitty runs low then each person is asked to add more money. At the end of the trip any money left over in the boat kitty is divided equally among each student on board.
- What is included will vary per yacht but as a guide a charter yacht will include: dinghy with motor, full cruising area charts and cruising guide or pilot book, navigational equipment (binoculars, hand bearing compass and course plotting equipment), initial full tank of water, fuel and cooking gas, VHF radio, electric anchor windlass, wind instruments, furling or battened mainsail, furling genoa sail, galley equipment (cooking and eating utensils), standard safety equipment (navigational and first aid), hot water, bed linen, stereo, dodger and bimini for shade, berthing fees at home port on the first and last evening of your course.

- I understand that Advantage Boating Inc., its agents, skippers and any other persons officially related to the "2027 BVI Course" programs organized by Advantage Boating Inc. are not responsible for any medical treatment on-board or otherwise.
- Advantage Boating Inc. will make every effort to maintain the complete itinerary but bad weather, heavy winds and unforeseen mechanical issues may alter the itinerary and yacht skippers and/or Advantage Boating Inc. "2027 BVI Course" instructors will make departure decisions based on these factors. Courses may sail in 6 Beaufort wind and sea conditions but any higher wind warnings may alter the itinerary. For safety reasons, I understand that the instructor's word is the law aboard ship and for the duration of the course.
